Annual Performance Report

The Annual Performance Report (APR), uses data from the 21APR Data Collection System to report on the *Government Performance and Results Act* (GPRA) performance indicators associated with the 21st CCLC program.

These metrics assist the federal government in determining progress of the 21st CCLC program based on the statutory requirements. The APR is completed once a year to summarize the operational elements of their program, the student population served, and the extent to which students improved in specific areas.

The Truman Pierce Institute annually uploads state data into the APR data collection system.

APR Data Collection and Input

All APR data is collected from EZ Reports

Data is input into federal APR system **three** times a year.

- Summer 2019 Data
- Fall 2019 Data
- Spring 2020 Data

It is important that Grantee data is uploaded in a **timely** manner.

Cohort 12 will remain active in EZ Reports until all Summer of 2019 is reported in APR system.

However, **no Cohort 12 data** (attendance) should be entered into EZ Reports after September 30.

Only **Cohorts 13 and 14 remain active** after September 30, 2019.
